Engineer and retired lieutenant colonel Dick Strawbridge (that offbeat captain with the big mustache on *Junkyard Mega-Wars*), "hippie" wife Brigit and their two children, Charlotte and James, moved from their comfortable Worcestershire, England, home into an expensive but derelict Cornwall farmhouse to live a greener modern life. "There's a lot of worthy, green people out there who are living off the grid," says Dick. "But what we're trying to do is to show that you can still live in the 21st century and do it." The family's move meant trading in their traditional heating, electricity and Dick's Audi convertible for, among other things, a slew of engineering projects. Like building a waterwheel and, in tonight's episode, installing a heating system utilizing wood-burning stoves. Dick insists that if people start small, they can accomplish anything. "It's like eating an elephant," he says. "You eat it a bite at a time." —Erica Silberstein
